Opening Gambit

After nearly a quarter-century on 57th Street, the Michael Rosenfeld Gallery has headed south—specifically, to a new light-filled space in Chelsea that's more than double the size of its previous digs. To celebrate, the gallery is hosting a major show, "a reintroduction of who we are and what we stand for," says Director Hallie Harrisburg. Indeed, *Insite/Inschelsea* offers nothing less than a survey course in 20th- and 21st-century American art, with 70-odd works that span the decades, movements and media. From Modernist Raymond Jonson's jazzy "City Lights" (above, 1933), to a 1973 back-to-folkcrafts vase by Peter Voulkos, it's a commemoration of the country's brilliantly diverse creatives.
