Los Angeles artist **Betye Saar** is one of the great assemblagists of our time. Her work has been the subject of solo exhibitions at the Studio Museum in Harlem, New York; the San Francisco Museum of Modern Art; and the Whitney Museum of American Art, New York. Saar's work was featured in the Hammer Museum exhibition *Now Dig This! Art and Black Los Angeles* 1960–1980. Saar received her BA from UCLA in 1949.
